

# **Arizona Real Estate Recovery Fund**



### What is the Recovery Fund?

- The Arizona Real Estate Recovery Fund is a fund of last resort for recovery of losses, caused by the conduct of an Arizona licensed real estate salesperson or broker in a real estate transaction (See Arizona Revised Statutes (ARS) Title 32, Chapter 20, Article 5, §32-2186 through §32- 2193.02)
- The Recovery Fund is administered under the direction of the Arizona Real Estate Commissioner.
- The Recovery Fund is funded from a surcharge on license fees. Tax dollars are not used.

### What can the Recovery Fund pay for?

- An action for a judgment that subsequently results in an order for payment from the Real Estate Recovery Fund shall not be started
  later than <u>5 years</u> from the actual cause of action.
- Actual and direct out of pocket loss to the aggrieved person in a real estate or cemetery plot transaction, as directly caused by the
  actions of an Arizona licensed real estate salesperson / broker as stipulated in the judgment.
- Reasonable attorney fees and other costs as stipulated in the judgment.
- The Real Estate Recovery Fund's liability shall not exceed:
  - ♦ Thirty thousand dollars for each transaction, regardless of the number of persons aggrieved; and
  - Ninety thousand dollars for each licensee.

### **Examples of Eligible Losses**

- Misappropriated earnest money deposit or the down payment of a house;
- Misappropriated security deposit, rental income, or money withheld that was intended for mortgage payments or other expenses managed by the Arizona real estate licensee;
- Repair costs required for defects when an Arizona real estate
   licensee materially misrepresented the condition of the property;
- Loss caused in a transaction when the Arizona real estate
  licensee has actively misrepresented the financial condition of the
  property and parties involved.

### **Examples of Ineligible Losses**

- Speculation including lost profits or unrealized losses
- Transactions for property outside of Arizona
- Loans, notes, limited partnerships or other securities, regardless
  of whether the loss was caused by an investment in, or was
  cured by real property
- Repair costs for defects that the purchaser was aware of
- A tenant's conduct or neglect
- Vandalism
- Natural causes
- Punitive damages
- Post judgment interest
- Undocumented transactions or losses

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#### How do I apply and get paid from the Recovery Fund?

- Obtain and record a judgment (civil or criminal) obtained against all parties involved in the transaction, including, but not limited to the
  Arizona real estate licensed salesperson and their employing broker (not a corporation, partnership or fictitious entity), and provide the
  Department an original certified recorded copy.
- The judgment must include the employing broker.
- Exhaust all efforts to collect the money awarded in the judgment (pursuant to A.R.S § 32-2188 (F)(8)) from all involved parties, and
  document all efforts to be provided to the Department.
- Download and complete the Recovery Fund Application (Form RF-107) available on <a href="www.azre.gov">www.azre.gov</a>
- Notify the Arizona real estate licensee(s) that a claim has been, or will be, filed against them from the Recovery Fund (Form RF-109).
- Proof of Service to the licensee is <u>required</u> in one of the following forms:
  - ♦ Personal Service (Form RF-110)
  - ♦ Certified Mail (Form RF-111)
  - ♦ Publication (Form RF-112)
- Obtain a writ of garnishment or execution against the Arizona real estate licensee through the court.
- Provide all requested documentation and/or any additional documentation to support your application.
